July 28 and August 20 Academic Circle Training

This summer there are two opportunities to learn how to use the peace circle method to meet academic goals. Restorative Practices and Peace Circles are increasingly used in

educational settings for resolving conflicts, building community and celebrating achievements. Another type of circle schools can use is the "Academic Circle."

In this workshop led by Avon Central School English teacher, Cordula Kennell, you will be introduced to the Peace Circle process, learn about using circles in the classroom as a tool for instruction and discussion, and come away with some ideas for using circles in your own classroom.

The July 28th date includes a half day of peace circle training followed by half day of academic circle training. The August 20th date is best for those already familiar with peace circles and will jump right into the academic portion focusing on how you can use circles to teach concepts and generate discussion.

Anyone interested in learning to facilitate Peace Circles

1-Day Peace Circle Training is an introduction to facilitating Peace Circles which provides the basic information needed to begin implementing the Peace Circle process.

3-Day Peace Circle Training involves learning how to facilitate Peace Circles through more extensive experiential learning. Participants gain in-depth knowledge of the elements of the circle process and the variety of purposes for which circles can be used. Participants will practice what they have learned by planning and facilitating a circle.

1 -Day Advanced Training: If you've been trained in Peace Circles and have observed, facilitated, or participated in Circles, this one-day course will provide a chance for you to explore advanced topics and raise questions based on your experiences. There will be an opportunity to hear from others who are using circles and share facilitation, observation experiences, successes, roadblocks and hopes.

2 Day Restorative Transition Circle Training

Training in a process to reintegrate people back into a community after having been absent for a period of time. Transition circles are designed to bring together those in transition from incarceration, addiction treatment or school suspension with their loved ones, supporters and other stakeholders. The focus of the circle is to repair relationships and develop a transition/re-entry plan. These circles can be modified for any circumstance where there is a need to reenter a community.

Peace Circle and Restorative Discipline Training Combo

Day 1 will be our Introduction to Peace Circle Training. The peacemaking circle brings people together for conflict resolution, healing, support, celebration, decision making or other activities in which honest communications, relationship development and community building are core desired outcomes.

Day 2 will be training in Restorative Discipline*. Participants will learn how to use the circle process to facilitate conflict circles, how to use a brief restorative conversation to address an issue quickly and using the fishbowl process for solving problems. We will also role play a community conference and take some time to see what is happening around the country in other schools. 8:30-4:30 pm each day

*Attendance in a 1-Day Peace Circle Training is a prerequisite for the Restorative Discipline Training. If you have already taken our 1-day peace circle training you have the option of registering for just the restorative discipline training day.

August 19

Restorative Discipline Training

Participants will learn how to use the circle process to facilitate conflict circles, how to use a brief restorative conversation to address an issue quickly and using the fishbowl process for solving problems. We will also role play a community conference and take some time to see what is happening around the country in other schools. 8:30-4:30 pm.
